Tasks to complete regularly. 'Little and often' is the best way.



Summer Term Reading and Fluency



We are so lucky to send our fabulous reading books home. Over the past year we have invested over £12,000 into our Infant books and we ask that you take care of these (be careful not to tear, chew or damage pages).

Each week your child receives:

- A phonics book (We ask that you read this every day to build your child's reading skills), Please keep these
 in your child's book bag each day as we love to take every opportunity to read.
- A 'Love of Reading Library book' (this is a picture book chosen by your child to share with you at bedtime
 and to enjoy hearing you read to them and then maybe join in as you read).

Please try and read little and often - reading daily will boost your child's reading fluency. Reading Records are for Parents to record how your child has found their reading. <u>Please make a short comment at least 4 times per week</u>. From time to time, we will make a short comment.

Your child will receive Dandelion reader books and/or Sounds~Write books. You will notice that the Sounds~Write books are a little trickier.

When your child receives their book:

<u>Monday</u> - Play the letter/word game at the back of the book. Make flashcards for the words in the book. Discuss new words and what they mean (i.e. 'sob', means to cry)

<u>Tuesday</u> - Read through the book - discuss what is happening in the pictures and discuss new words (i.e. a 'mac' is another name for a raincoat)

Wednesday - Read the story - pointing to each word and sounding out new words.

Thursday - Sunday - Build your reading fluency - read without sounding out each word.

"Fluency is defined as the ability to read with speed, accuracy, and proper expression".

We will change books when your child reads their book with fluency. By the end of Reception, children should be reading books at their level with ease and expression.

What is reading fluency?

- Reading fluency is a set of skills that refer to a student's speed, accuracy, and ease of oral reading.
- A fluent reader ...
 - recognizes most words by sight.
 - is able to read aloud easily, smoothly, and with the rhythm of natural speech.
 - decodes unknown words quickly.
 - attends to punctuation.
 - reads with proper expression.
- Fluent readers gain more meaning from the what they read and enjoy reading more than students who devote all their energy to sounding out words.

So, how do you build fluency?

- Listen to your child reread every day
- Read it again and again...
- Offer help when your child gets stuck, and always give lots of praise and encouragement.

Your child has a reading day in class but will also be heard read throughout the week. Please keep their Reading Book and Reading Record in their book bag every day.

Handwriting Fun!

This term we will be focusing on our handwriting skills in our daily handwriting sessions. Each week we will be focusing on our handwriting families, as we focus on writing our letters with the correct orientation (forming them correctly from the right starting point), focusing on the size and writing on the lines.

By the end of Reception children at the expected level of development will:

- Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing – using the tripod grip in almost all cases and

- Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed.


So, what can you do at home?


